When the unexpected happens — floods, power cuts, severe weather — communities need organisations like BLSAR to step in. This role helps us stay prepared. You'll build partnerships with local emergency planners and make sure BLSAR is ready to assist when called.

What You Might Be Doing

- Liaising with local emergency planning officers and forums
- Representing BLSAR at Local Resilience Forum (LRF) meetings
- Identifying how BLSAR can support regional emergency plans
- Helping plan and deliver relevant training exercises
- Developing simple, scalable processes for emergency activation
- Building resilience plans to keep BLSAR operational during a crisis
- Maintaining awareness of local risks and response needs

This role is strategic, but not isolated — you'll be supported by the Leadership Team and other operational leads.

- Confident communicator and relationship builder
- Calm under pressure and comfortable planning for uncertainty
- Organised and methodical, with good attention to detail
- Able to influence and collaborate with external agencies
